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Post-Doctoral Program in Museology

Post-Doctoral Regulations at ULHT. Joint Order No. 19/2011

Post-doctoral applications for projects to be developed in the areas where there are Doctoral Programs will be regulated by the provisions indicated below. Interested parties should send their application to the Doctoral Program Coordination of the desired area through a letter of intent, accompanied by a Curriculum Vitae and a detailed presentation of the research project they propose to develop. Preference will be given to articulation with ongoing research projects.

Regulations

Applications are open permanently. National and foreign researchers may apply. Applicants must hold a doctoral degree obtained less than five years ago. In exceptional cases, applications from doctoral researchers for more than five years may be accepted by the Scientific Committee of the Programs. Researchers whose doctoral exams will take place within a period of no more than three months may apply on a conditional basis. Once the application is accepted by the Scientific Committee of the Course, the administrative process must be instructed with the following elements:

- a) detailed CV;
- b) PhD certificate (original or certified photocopy);
- c) Work project to be developed in the desired area;
- d) Opinion of the ULHT researcher who has accepted to be supervisor of the post-doctoral project or has been nominated by the Scientific Committee of the Doctoral Course in the intended area;
- e) Letter (s) of recommendation (optional);
- f) 5 copies of relevant publications;
- g) Copy of the Identity Card or Passport;
- h) 1 Updated photograph, in color, 2x3 cm.

Postdoctoral programs should last between six months and three years. The applications are assessed by the Scientific Committee of the Doctoral Program in the intended area. In case of approval, the Program Coordination will certify to the financing entities its availability to serve as a host institution. It is assumed that candidates will ensure the necessary financial means for their stay. ULHT will under no circumstances assume any responsibilities in this area. It is

the obligation of the postdoctoral fellow to present a Seminar on his research, to publish at least one scientific article in one of the ULHT journals, and in general, to participate in the scientific activities of the host area. Post-doctoral researchers will be provided with the necessary conditions to carry out the work to be developed, namely regarding access to research spaces, laboratories, library and respective bibliographic collection. - The completion of a postdoctoral program must be enrolled in the Academic Services, with fees due (values updated annually)

13 - At the end of the post-doctoral program, the respective qualitative assessment is made based on the research work carried out by the post-doctoral student and the Advisor's opinion.

14 - The successful completion of the post-doctoral program gives rise to the award of a certificate of achievement, issued by the Academic Services.

15 - This Joint Order revokes Joint Orders No. 7/2008 and 02/2011 and comes into force on the present date.
